EYPP children at Monkchester started the year with a lower baseline than other groups and so needed to make accelerated progress in order to catch up to where they should be before moving to Primary Schools. Accelerated progress = anything 3+ points.

For the EYPP group of children at Monkchester Road Nursery School, the children who qualified for EYPP made excellent progress in all aspects of learning.

The children who qualified for EYPP made slowest progress overall in Literacy, suggesting that this aspect of learning needs to remain a focus of our EYPP plan in the coming year.

Our children made swiftest progress in Expressive Arts and Design.

We usually write our new plans in November as soon as our baseline activities are completed and we know which of our children will qualify for EYPP.

Across all three of our schools, Covid impacted on our EYPP plans as children often had to self-isolate in their bubbles or individually. This meant that children were not always in school as often as they normally would be. We diverted some of our funds in to remote learning activities and included resource packs for children to take home to support their home learning. This included free storybooks for our EYPP children.

This chart shows the attainment of our EYPP children - at baseline and on exit at the end of their Nursery year. It shows that the majority of our EYPP children reached similar standards to other children by the end of the year with most achieving at or above expected attainment before they left for their Primary Schools. The lowest levels of attainment were in Literacy and highest in PSED. Literacy is a focus for next year's EYPP Plan.
